Are you a veteran or the spouse of a veteran?

The Jobs for Veterans Act affords priority of service to covered veterans and eligible spouses over non-covered persons for the receipt of employment, training, and placement services provided under new or existing job training programs funded in whole or in part, by the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL).

AM I ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible for priority of service you must meet the following definition as a Covered Person

The term 'covered person' means any of the following individuals:

- A veteran
The term "veteran" means a person who served in the active military, naval, or air service, and who was discharged or released therefrom under conditions other than dishonorable.
- The spouse of any of the following individuals
 - Any veteran who died of a service connected disability
 - Any veteran who has a total disability resulting from a service-connected disability.
 - Any veteran who died while a disability so evaluated was in existence.
 - Any member of the Armed Forces serving on active duty who, at the time of application for assistance under this section, is listed, pursuant to section 556 of title 37 and regulations issued thereunder, by the Secretary concerned in one or more of the following categories and has been so listed for a total of more than 90 days:
 - missing in action, captured in line of duty by a hostile force, or forcibly detained or interned in line of duty by a foreign government or power.

WHAT IT MEANS

- Veterans priority of service means the right of eligible covered persons to take precedence over eligible non-covered persons in obtaining services. For example, this could mean:
 - The covered person receives access to the service or resource earlier in time than the non-covered person; or
 - If the service or resource is limited, the covered person receives access to the service or resource before the non-covered person.



WHAT ARE THE ELIGIBLE PROGRAMS?

Below is a list of programs affected by the passage of the priority of service law. This list is not all inclusive, but provides a good idea of the type of programs in which priority of service to qualified veterans exists.

Before priority of service can be extended to any covered person in these programs, the covered person MUST be qualified to participate in the program.

- WIA Adult and Dislocated Worker
- Wagner-Peyser Employment Service
- Trade Act Programs
- National Emergency Grants
- Senior Community Service Employment Program(SCSEP)
- Migrant and Seasonal Farm Worker Program
- Indian and Native American Program
- Job Corps
- WIA Demonstration Projects
- Labor Market Information Grants
- Career One-Stop Electronic Tools
- Other Internet-based self-service tools operated by DOL programs
